



- safety
- vibrancy / livability
- access options
- These trials will inform future decisions about more permanent changes to Ponsonby Road.

Why Ponsonby Road?



City Centre and fringe area populations are expected to **increase by 58,000 people** in the next 30 years



25,000 vehicles per day travel along Ponsonby Road (Picton Street to Newton Road)



Up to 44 buses per hour operate along the corridor during peak times, with this expected to **increase** to 60 buses per hour by 2028.



11 DSI (Death or Serious Injury) crashes occurred along the corridor between 2014-2018, 72% of which involved vulnerable road users



Footpath surfaces are poor throughout corridor – footpaths cracking, tree roots uplifting pavement, unexpected entranceways and exists



Aligned with Waitematā Local Board Plans



Recognise Ponsonby Road's diverse role as a vibrant centre, key entertainment and boutique-shopping locality that meets the needs of local residents, businesses and visitors



Protect, recognise and interpret the **historic and cultural heritage** of Ponsonby Road. This is an opportunity to **tell** stories



Develop Ponsonby Road with various **transport options** that prioritise the safety of pedestrians and cyclists



Contribute to the achievement of region-wide improvements to the **natural environment**



Ensure sufficient provision of open space and community facilities to meet the needs of the Ponsonby community both now and in the future



Who is funding the project?

One of 21 projects across Auckland that are part of Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency's Innovating Streets programme.

This aims to make it faster and easier to transition streets to **safer, more vibrant spaces** where people can easily get to work, and access shops and services.

Waka Kotahi provides 90% funding.

AT provides remaining 10% and tasked with delivery.



Myth busters

AT have already decided what the changes are (They haven't)

There is a hidden agenda to prioritise walking, cycling, and bus access

(It's not a hidden agenda, but an overt one supported by the local board, council, Waka Kotahi NZTA, and the Ministry of Transport)





Safety

Safety covers a broad spectrum of actual and perceived personal and physical safety. How safe is Ponsonby Road for all users?

- Common conflict areas with other users
- Confusion about who has priority
- Vision Zero outcomes
- Use of the road and footpath
- Speed and unpredictability
- Crossing behaviours

Access

- · Needed for medical and emergency services
- Needed for elderly
- Add disability parks

Modes



Pedestrians

Crossings

- · Pedestrians randomly crossing
- Pedestrians crossing through stopped vehicles
- · More safe places to cross needed
- Warnings for vehicles and/or peds when approaching raised tables at the top of side streets
- · Clarity on who has priority at top of side streets
- Longer phasing for pedestrians at signalized intersections
- · Diagonal crossing at intersections

Footpath quality

- Trip hazards
- Uneven surfaces
- Difficult to navigate in the dark

Klds

· Schools and walking connections





- Design intersections for bikes
- Add bike lanes
- Add bike parking
- Riding down footpaths
- Speed
- Unpredictable movements



- Pick-up and drop-offs in the middle of lanes
- Provide specific Taxi/Uber zones
- Blocking outside lane (e.g. outside bars and restaurants at night)
- Unsafe u-turns





Speed

- Enforce 40km/h
- Make 40km/h more prominent to drivers



Bus & PT


- Priority (bus/T3 lanes)
- Location of bus stops
- Bunching of Innerlink busses

Loading and servicing

- Obstructions in lanes whilst deliveries are completed
- · Varying hours of delivery

Intersections

- Poor visibility and sight lines past parked vehicles
- · Signalized vs. un-signalized
- · Right turning out of side streets



Parking

- Incorrectly parked vehicles encroaching on live traffic lane
- Holding up traffic whilst maneuvering into parks
- Safety risk pulling out
- Poor visibility and sight lines past parked cars
- Add disability parks
- · Add loading zone
- · Add parking buildings

Enforcement

- Speed
- Red light running
- Parking on Ponsonby Road







Differentiate from malls



Public amenities

Street art

- Places to rest
- Public toilets
- Water fountains
- Rubbish bins (tidy)



- Native trees
- Planter boxes
- Promote parks and green spaces
- Community gardens





- Places to play (e.g. kids activities)
- Street/public art
- More events (e.g. Market Days)
- Music and performances
