Parking limit 'V'

indicates no room for a parked vehicle

Prolongation

projection of a linear feature to a remote location

Resolution Report

the document that records regulatory and mandatory local

authority rules

Road Hierarchy

Strategic Routes — Network of strategic national importance, including motorways, state highways and associated on—off ramps.

Regional Arterials — Up to and in excess of 40000 vehicles/day. Carry major traffic between principal sectors of the region not covered by the Strategic Routes.

District Arterials — Range of 5000 to 25000 vehicles/day. Carry traffic between major areas of the City, partly shared with the regional arterials.

Collector Roads — Range of 3000 to 10000 vehicles/day. Collect and distribute traffic to and from the arterial network, as well as the links between arterials.

Local Roads — Less than 3000 vehicles/day. Provide direct access to abutting property. Includes service lanes and carparks.

Side island

an island located at the side of the road seperated from the kerb

by a water channel

Slip lane

an auxillary piece of carriageway which filters turning traffic off the

main road

Southern approach

travelling south approaching a point

Speed table

a traffic calming device designed as a long speed hump with a flat

section in the middle

Speed hump

an artificial ridge set crosswise into the surface of a road, parking

lot, or driveway to make the operators of vehicles decrease speed

Splitter island

an island separating same direction traffic lanes

Termination line

a yellow line perpendicular to the kerbline painted at the end of a

broken line

Throat Island

an island separating opposing traffic at an intersection

Tracking line

the wear on the road indicating the line which vehicles follow

naturally

Vehicle kerb ramp (vehicle crossing)

a kerb cutting and associated sealed area across the berm and footpath leading from the carriageway to a property driveway /

property

Vehicle crossing

The paving across the berm and footpath from the vehicle  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{kerb}}$ 

ramp to the road corridor boundary

Verge

grassy border along a road
